She considers how socialised recruitment and gendered taste result in exclusion, and uncovers subtle forms of sexism that cause women's stories and voices to be discounted. *Gender Inequality in Screenwriting Work* also reveals the hidden labour market of the UK film industry, built on personal connections, homophily and the myth of meritocracy.
